

Real Estate Professional FAQ

Q: How can the Commission's programs help me?

A: The Commission's programs can expand your client base, putting homeownership within reach for many families who otherwise might struggle to bridge the financial gap. This helps you sell more homes, play an important role in the community, and expand your clients' options.

Q: How can the Commission's programs help my buyers?

A: The Commission's programs empower potential homebuyers with the financing assistance and information they need to purchase a home of their own, turning them from renters into buyers.

Q: Where do I register to be "certified"?
