

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

The Washington State Housing Finance Commission (the “Commission”) will hold an open public hearing for the purpose of considering a plan of finance with respect to the reissuance by the Commission of one or more series of tax-exempt revenue bonds (the “Bonds”) originally issued to finance the acquisition of land and existing facilities to be owned by Food Lifeline, a Washington nonprofit corporation and an organization described under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the “Code”). The reissued Bonds may be issued as one or more series issued from time to time and may include one or more series of refunding obligations. The public hearing will be held remotely starting at 10:00 a.m, Wednesday, July 24, 2024.

The Bonds will be reissued pursuant to Chapter 43.180 of the Revised Code of Washington for the purpose of refinancing a nonprofit facility under Section 145 of the Code.

The proceeds of the Bonds will be used to provide financing for the following project:

Proceeds of the reissued Bonds were used to the purchase price of all or a portion of land and two buildings, totaling approximately 204,000 sq. ft., with 174 parking spaces, and to pay all or a portion of the costs of issuing the Bonds. Food Lifeline is the owner and operator of the facilities financed by the reissued Bonds.

This notice and the provision of toll-free telephone access are intended to comply with the public notice requirements of Section 147(f) of the Code. Written comments with respect to the proposed plan of financing for the Project and the proposed Bonds may be mailed or faxed to the attention of Jason Hennigan, WSHFC, Multifamily Housing and Community Facilities Division, 1000 Second Avenue, Suite 2700, Seattle, WA 98104-3601 or to (206) 587-5113, for receipt no later than 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, July 23, 2024. Public testimony will be heard from all interested members of the public attending the hearing. The Commission will consider the public testimony and written comments in determining if the project will receive funding from tax-exempt bonds. Testimony and written comments regarding land use, zoning and environmental regulation should be directed to the local jurisdiction that is authorized to consider these matters when issuing building permits for the project.

The results of the hearing will be sent to the Governor for approval.
